



# PROJECT REPORT FOR COOPERATION PROJECTS BETWEEN ECOWEEK & SHOROUQ SOCIETY FOR WOMEN

### A. GENERAL

NGO ECOWEEK based in Jerusalem (Israel) and Shorouq Society for Women based in Al-Azaryia (West Bank) cooperated in the years 2010 and 2013 within the framework of the ECOWEEK programs that took place on July 25-August 1, 2010 and on March 3-8, 2013.

# **B. PARTNERS**

SHOROUQ is a Palestinian non-profit organization, located in Azariya, officially established in 2002. Shorouq is committed to bringing Palestinian women into the public sphere and works with Palestinian women regardless religious or political beliefs and is dedicated to the vision of peace by supporting and training independent women to build a better future. Shorouq's vision of peace reflects the understanding that women have much to gain through proliferation of peace. Shorouq is actively building partnerships with local women's organization throughout Palestine, the region and abroad, including a small and micro-enterprises program between Israeli and Palestinian women and a small animals program to promote the local economy in Azaryia. The Shorouq Center is a safe place for women to meet and engage in education, empowerment, health and culture.

Within the framework of this cooperation SHOROUQ provided:

- A local platform for cooperation in the West Bank.
- A resource for the involvement of women young professionals in the ECOWEEK activity.
- The premises of the Shorouq Center for meetings and as a design challenge.
- A point of contact and cooperation between the local authorities in Al-Azaryia and the ECOWEEK workshop team.

ECOWEEK is an international NGO started in 2005 and established as a non-profit entity in Greece and Israel in 2007 with the mission to raise environmental awareness and to promote the principles of sustainability. ECOWEEK is active in 15 countries and has members in 54 countries. ECOWEEK has been actively organizing sustainable design workshops and international professional meetings and conferences for young architects and designers throughout Europe and the Middle East since 2008 with an emphasis on sustainable design, green buildings, and programs for young professionals with a sustainability agenda.

Within the framework of this cooperation ECOWEEK provided:

- A local platform for cooperation in Israel.
- A platform for the increase of environmental awareness and the promotion of sustainability and sustainable design in the region.
- A platform for cooperation between Israeli and Palestinian young professionals.
- A platform for training and education for young professionals, and a point for learning from and networking with international peers and established professionals.
- A platform for sustainable design solutions to real local sites and venues.
