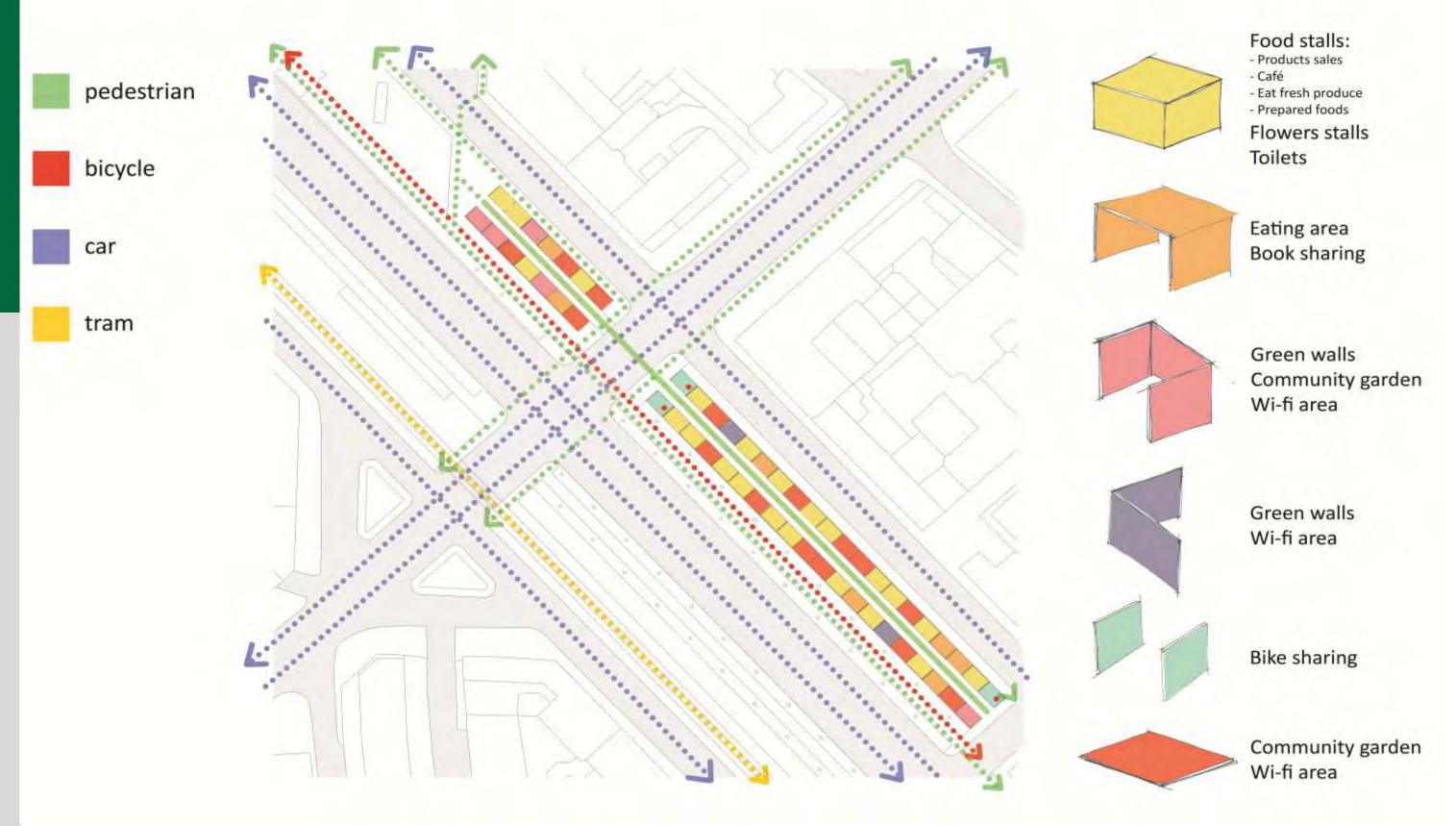


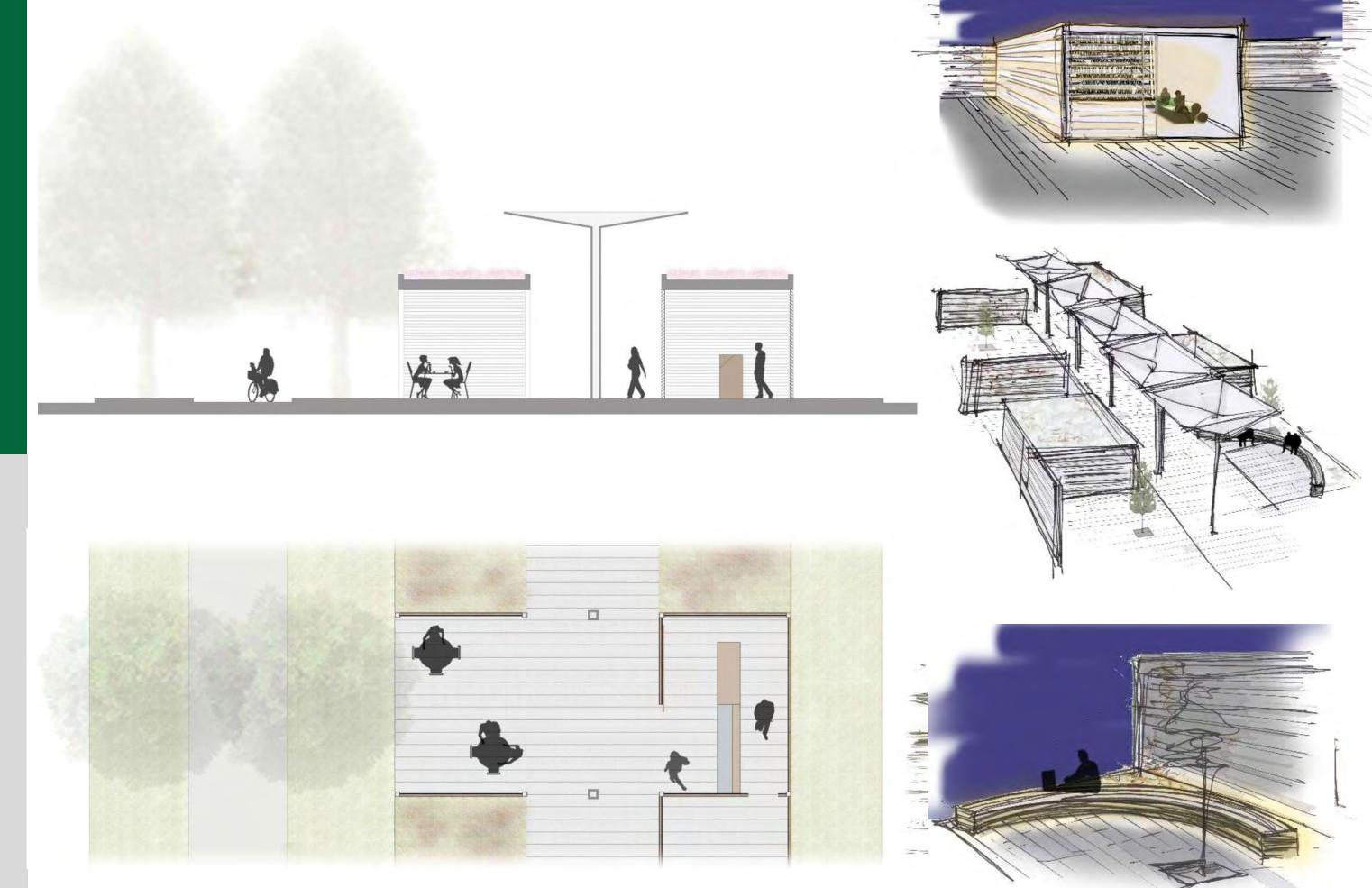
# A MARKET IN CORSO SEMPIONE

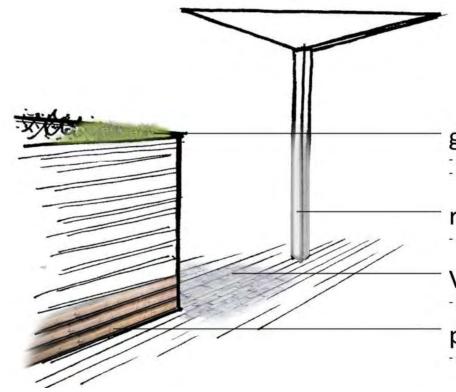












- green roof:
