

Thiseio District

This site is located in Thiseio district, Akamantos street, number 26. Thiseio is a neighborhood in Athens downtown, in the northwest of Acropolis. Its name derives from the Temple of Hephaestus, also known as Thiseio, as in earlier times, it was considered to be a temple of Theseus. The area is known as an entertainment place, due to the fact that many café and restaurants are located in the main road Agiou Paulou, which leads to the Acropolis. The spectacular view towards the Acropolis is one of the main attributes that turned Thiseio to one of the most attractive place to live in Athens.

The site has three facades attached to old and new buildings, none of which are higher than 2 floor buildings. The main façade on Akamantos has a view on Philopappou Hill. The neighborhood is quiet, although it is in the center of Athens. The access is served by bus and electric railway.
